

THE ARDENT SUPPORTER OF TALIBAN (TTP)

• Imran Khan's vocal opposition to kinetic options against TTP in Pakistan has earned him the pejorative nickname "Taliban Khan".



• On his watch, there was a significant rise in Islamist militancy in Pakistan, and religious extremists strengthened their position.

September 2013: He attempted to defend

TTP's twin suicide bombing on a church, through a conspiracy theory that it has been done by 'someone' to sabotage the peace talks.

TTP terrorists used his anti-drone rallies





to build victim image and to shield themselves from domestic / global scrutiny.



THE VICTIM BLAMING AND RAPE APOLOGIST

- Khan was criticized for rape victim blaming, he said that, "temptation should be removed as not everyone has willpower".
- In 2021, Imran Khan said, sexual
 violence results from women wearing "very



few clothes,"
implying only
"robots" could
remain unaffected.



- **Misogynist**: He also passed misogynist remarks against Afghan women in December 2021.
- Rights groups accused him of "baffling ignorance" after he said that rape cases had risen because of "vulgarity". His repeated victimblaming, a sexist slur, and scapegoating of women's attire underscore his entrenched misogyny.

KHAN APPLAUDED ALLIED WITHDRAWAL, HAILED SURRENDER OF US TRAINED AFGHAN ARMY AND CELEBRATED RETURN OF TALIBAN

■ Following the US withdrawal from Afghanistan in August 2021, Imran Khan asserted Taliban have "broken the shackles of slavery." He also ridiculed the allied exit, and hailed the swift surrender of Afghan National Army, sparking broad criticism for legitimizing Taliban control.

surrendered, President Ghani fled the country, and Taliban took control.

KHAN CALLED OSAMA BIN LADEN A MARTYR

- Use of "Shaheed" (Martyr) in Parliament: In a June 2020 address to the National Assembly, Imran Khan referred to Osama bin Laden as a "shaheed," triggering widespread backlash for glorifying a global terrorist.
- Political opponents and international observers condemned

arguing it **undermined Pakistan's counterterrorism commitments** and disregarded bin Laden's role in

orchestrating violent attacks.

■ 21 June, 2021: Further cementing the perception about PTI's stance on extremism, even his foreign minister (Shah Mahmood Qureshi) refused to condemn OBL.

• This **soft attitude** later **manifested** itself in the shape of **negotiations** with **TTP** which **brought** back **terrorism** in **Pakistan**.

KHAN REFUSED TO CONDEMN THE ATTACK ON NOBEL LAUREATE MALALA


• 9 October 2012: When asked by Syed Talat Hussain, following the 2012 attack on Malala Yousafzai by the TTP, Imran Khan notably refrained from explicitly condemning the group, fuelling suspicions of sympathy or tacit support. Instead of naming the perpetrators, Khan framed the attack as a broader societal issue, avoiding any

denunciation of the TTP, a stance critic labelled as "cowardly".

An op-ed,"Shame on you,Mr Khan" (The



Express Tribune, 2012), blasted Khan for his spineless response to TTP terrorism. It labeled his stance "compromised" and "morally untenable," arguing that his evasive rhetoric emboldened terrorists while undermining Pakistan's fight against terrorism.



KHAN IS ANTI WEST / ANTI US

• Imran Khan has repeatedly warned of consequences to adopt western culture that has "morally decayed".



Despite previously lambasting Donald Trump's foreign policy,
 calling it "racist," "anti-Muslim," and a threat to peace, Imran Khan's
 Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has recently shifted tone.







- Interestingly, his party now appears eager to align with Trump's incoming administration. Critics in Pakistan perceive this pivot as opportunistic.
- Most importantly, since April 2022, his conspiracy theories, blaming US for fall of PTI government, has caused anti-Americanism to sky-rocket in Pakistan.

KHAN REFUSES TO OWN HIS DAUGHTER

 Imran Khan has been embroiled in a longstanding controversy for allegedly fathering an illegitimate daughter, Tyrian Jade White,

with the late Sita White, yet consistently denying paternity.

In 1997, Sita White filed a paternity suit in a California court, ultimately winning the

case that affirmed Khan's fatherhood, despite his repeated public denials and refusal to provide any paternal care.



Even afterthe legalverdict, Khanomitted Tyrianfrom his



nomination papers and never publicly acknowledged her or fatherly affection. It raises questions about his character and sense of responsibility.

CORRUPTION, SELLING STATE GIFTS. **BRIBERY**

Corruption - Imran, Bushra Bibi and Gogi Nexus: His wife and

her front-woman Farah Gogi are widely believed to be part of the corrupt gang. Since his ouster from government, Farah Gogi has fled and not returned from abroad. Khan and Bushra continue to face corruption charges and convictions.

Khan and his wife have been tried and convicted in a corruption case involving

unethical selling of expensive state gifts, to pocket the profit. The same was neither declared in his FBR returns, nor in the nomination papers.

A1 Qadir **Corruption Case**: Khan and his wife are also undergoing trial in case of GBP 190 Million **Corruption** whereby they are accused of accepting bribe to



benefit a property tycoon (Malik Riaz). A classic case of misuse of authority for personal gains.

DISRUPTIONS / VIOLENCE / CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE

• Khan has a **history** of inciting disruptions, **violence** and contradictions, including incidents like attack on PTV, and numerous

onslaughts after 9 April 2022, most notably 9 May 2023, when Khan's supporters attacked government, military and intelligence setups.



- Khan is known for use of **polarising** and **demeaning language** publicly **accusing rivals**, and **name calling** in a **humiliating** manner, causing deep societal fissures.
- Incitement & Civil Disobedience: Known for inherent contradictions in personality, Khan once asked his followers to publicly burn the utility bills. Nevertheless, as reported by a journalist, he cleared his own bill, on time.





No RESPECT FOR RULE OF LAW

- Imran Khan displayed consistent disregard for rule of law. His actions and rhetoric especially after his removal from power through democratic means, are at tangent to democratic norms.
- He frequently criticized judicial decisions unfavorable to him and challenged judicial authority.

IMRAN KHAN IS UNDEMOCRATIC

- Imran Khan's tenure is remembered for political victimization of his opponents.
- During his government, NAB & FIA
 were extensively used to target political
 rivals.
- After vote of no confidence in 2022, Imran Khan decided to resign from parliament and take to the streets.
- Following his removal through democratic means, Khan sought negotiations



with the **establishment** instead of political stake holders.







THE POLITICS OF NAME-CALLING: IMRAN KHAN'S DIVISIVE RHETORIC

• Imran Khan often resorted to namecalling and personal attacks against his political opponents, a tactic that undermines the decorum of public discourse.

IMRAN KHAN: A PREDATOR OF FREE SPEECH

- Imran Khan was declared predator of free speech by Reporters Without Borders for his government's actions against freedom for speech.
- During his tenure, journalists were harassed, media outlets were censored and in some cases, journalists being physically attacked besides regulatory crackdowns and financial pressures.
- 11 journalists / media house owner
 were targeted including Editor-in-Chief of



Jang, The News and Geo, Mir Shakil-ur-Rehman, the owner of Jang



Group was kept in detention for months. Mohsin Baig was arrested for expressing critical views against his government. While prominent anchors Hamid Mir and Talat Hussain were taken off-air. Additionally, YouTubers Asad Ali Toor and Ahmad Noorani were subjected to physical torture while Matiullah Jan was 'abducted'.

This highlights alarming suppression of press freedom during his period.

IMRAN KHAN'S APPROACH TO PAK-SAUDI RELATIONS

- During his tenure, Pakistan's
 foreign relations faced significant
 setbacks especially with Saudi Arabia.
- He blamed Saudi Arabia for forbidding him to attend Kuala Lumpur Summit.







- He criticized the Saudi-led OIC for inaction on Kashmir, straining ties with Saudi leadership.
- Imran Khan passed derogatory remarks about Saudi Crown Prince Muhammad Bin Salman in cabinet meeting.
- Pakistan delayed repaying a \$3 billion Saudi
 loan, forcing Riyadh to demand early repayment.



IMRAN KHAN'S ANTI-STATE RHETORIC

- Imran Khan urged IMF not to approve loans for Pakistan, undermining country's economic revival.
- He drew controversial parallels
 between Pakistan's political situation
